Writing Across the Curriculum - Gr 4-8 teachers (Shelley Stagg Peterson)

In this session grades, 4-8 teachers will be introduced to strategies for using writing as a learning tool that will work in many subject areas, though the examples will be in

particular subjects.

Closing the Writing Gap in Kindergarten to Grade 3 (Miriam Trehearne)

Unlock each student's writing potential! In this practical session you will learn how to engage even the most reluctant writers. Clear writing expectations, motivating writing activities and mini-lessons that support the reading-writing connection will be shared. Develop students who think, act and write like real writers. And, enhance those home-school connections.
