As Alberta Education moves forward in the curriculum development process, we are re-examining the ways in which we provide professional learning opportunities and information to our stakeholders. In the past, Curriculum Coordinator meetings provided system leaders with updates about Alberta Education's direction and objectives. In replacement of Curriculum Coordinators meetings we will have "Leading Curriculum Learning" workshops. Alberta Education is working in partnership with ARPDC to co-host Leading Curriculum Learning Workshops and we look forward to seeing you at this event.

Please bring your personal device (laptop preferred over tablet or phone) for work with the CMA. Please ensure that you have access to your personal learnalberta.ca account as there will be an interactive portion with the platform during the presentation.

The new LearnAlberta.ca (formerly known as the Curriculum Development and Management Application, or CDMA) is a custom-developed software tool created to help develop, update and implement provincial curriculum in a digital format. The vision of the new LearnAlberta.ca is to provide a bilingual, one-stop-shop for Alberta teachers, parents, students and all other stakeholders so they can access tools and services related to provincial curriculum. As of October 10, 2018, this beta version will provide the ability for our stakeholders to provide feedback on the website, which will be used to help inform future iterations of this innovative tool.

Teachers will be able to review the future draft K–4 curriculum in English and French (where applicable). In addition, teachers who create an account within our Provincial Education Directory can interact with the draft curriculum, become familiar with its architecture and design, utilize specific tools for teachers and collaborate with their colleagues. LearnAlberta.ca is a custom-developed digital resource repository that has been maintained by Alberta Education since 1999, and it will continue to be available until a full transition plan is in place and approved.
