Program

During the month of July join the KTCEA teachers and instructional leaders from Treaty 8 virtually, using Google Meet and Google Classroom platforms to prioritize and identify the essential learning outcomes from the current grade 1 - 6 curriculum, in the areas of English Language Arts, Social Studies, Mathematics and Science, using Alberta Education's current Programs of Study.

With the assistance of Corrie Ziegler, the working group will also examine cross curricular prioritizing and the **infusion of Indigenous foundational knowledge** into each of the curriculum areas identified, per grade level.

The goal will be to create a document that offers a curriculum map, with priorities displayed for each grade in each core subject area. This document will be provided to all participants involved.

Advantages of the completed curriculum map include:

- Clarity and consistency related to the Grade 1-6 Essential Learning Outcomes in the four subject areas identified in the current curriculum;
 - Understanding of curriculum sequencing from grade to grade for each of the identified subject areas;
 - Understanding of what must be assessed (for and of) in each of the identified subject areas per grade
