This year we will 'Come Together' for a combination of Indigenous Learning Series and work toward the success of all students meeting the new Alberta TQS standards. This year's theme is "Live the Learning"

Series 3 - Infusing Indigenous Knowledge into the Curriculum: "Live the Learning-Teacher Feature"

This 6 week series will feature teachers from Treaty 8, Zone 1 presenting examples of how they have infused Indigenous Knowledge into the curriculum of various subjects at various grade levels.

The series will begin with a session from Jaime Chalifoux, Indigenous Education Coach with High Prairie School Division, that will help you think about ways to infuse Indigenous knowledge into your curriculum and will also provide you with many examples of how this can be done. The series continues each week with 'Teacher Features" from different Division/Grade Levels and culminate with a review and sharing of curriculum mapping documents that embed Indigenous Knowledge into Gr. 1-6 Core Subjects.
