KTCEA High School teachers and Curriculum Instruction Specialists will meet virtually to engage in groundbreaking work to examine Alberta Education's high school curriculum (grades 10 - 12) from an Indigenous perspective. The group will work collaboratively to organize the curriculum's key ideas/topics by season, for English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and CTS. The working group will align the identified subjects with land-based learning, Cree Ways of Knowing and Being including the Cree Language, connect outcomes to the KTCEA local context and significant local land sites, to create a relevant and consistent curriculum for all KTCEA high school students. Outcomes will include a list of Indigenous activities and resources including significant local land sites, access to local Elders, and protocols, to help bring each subject alive and relevant for KTCEA students
